**In Remembrance:**

Mr. George Herbert Axson died on January 2, 2019. His wife Edith was a lifetime member of the society. In 2005 restoration of the Koger House began. In the upstairs bedroom, bees were coming into the house. Mr. Fitzhugh said that they had had a “bee problem” since the 1940s. I asked Mr. George to check out our problem. It turned out to be a massive problem. The bees had made a hive between the interior and exterior walls. The hive was at least 8-10 feet wide and floor to ceiling. I visited the house the day Mr. George was removing the hive. He had tubs of hive and honey in the back of his truck. He said he had never seen anything like it. It took days to remove all of the traces of these bees. The new interior walls replaced the old and we thought our bee problem was over. Guess what? They are back. We will have to address the problem again.

Mr. and Mrs. George Axson were great friends of the society and will truly be missed.
